Again, Mr. Muggeridge, a Socialist member, mentions the Welsh language: "Does the Minister think it advisable to keep up these barbarian languages" (Laughter).

2. Wales takes a Back Seat

Unjust foreign government has given poverty, unemployment and ill-health to Wales

Lowest Standard of Living

Wales has the lowest standard of living in Britain.

Unemployment

During the period 1932-37 the percentage of unemployment in Wales was between 80 per cent. and 120 per cent. higher than in England. In September, 1937, England had 8 per cent. unemployed; Wales had 20 per cent.

Depopulation

Between 1901 and 1931 the population of eight of the thirteen counties of Wales has decreased.

Over 350,000 emigrated from Wales between 1921 and 1935. In England during 1921–1935 the population has increased by 2,000,000.

Ill-health

i. In 1934 five Welsh counties headed the lists of deaths from tuberculosis in England and Wales; out of 62 Welsh and English counties, ten Welsh counties were among the fifteen highest.

ii. In 1934 the percentage of deaths of mothers during childbirth was 55 per cent. higher in Wales than in England.

ENGLAND DISCRIMINATES AGAINST WALES . . .

Recently the National Esteddfod of Wales and the English National Opera each applied to Parliament for subsidy grants.

Thousands of pounds were voted for the English National Opera; Parliament merely laughed at the idea of subsidising the Welsh National Eisteddfod.

No New Industries for Wales

In 1934, 477 new industries were established in England; in Wales one was established. In 1935, 505 new industries in England; in Wales, four new and five closed.

Although Welsh miners were in distress the English Labour Government in 1924 granted two million pounds to subsidise

the opening of new coal mines in Kent.

3. The Benefits of Self-Government

"SELF-GOVERNMENT FOR EVERY PEOPLE" is the law of civilisation and the basic principle of the League of Nations

To deny a nation's freedom is to justify ignorance and tyranny.

A Parliament for the People

A Welsh Parliament will have the TIME, the UNDER-STANDING and the INCLINATION to govern Wales well.

Wales is big enough

S'xteen of the states members of the League of Nations have smaller populations than Wales. Every one of these states is more prosperous than Wales.

Wales is Wealthy

Wales is richer in resources than any other area of equal size in Britain.

Economy

Self-government is always cheaper than foreign government.

What Freedom can do for Wales

Peace: A free Wales will pursue a peaceful policy. Her contributions to England's annual war-bill of £300,000,000 will cease. Until she is free Wales will be tied to England's war-chariot.

Industrial Development: A Welsh Government will immediately apply itself to the development of existing Welsh industries, and the establishment of new ones. The English Government keeps its new industries in England. Under self-government 800 new industries were established in the Irish Free State between 1931 and 1935.

Language and Culture: Only self-government can preserve and invigorate the language and culture of Wales. History shows that the culture of every subject nation decays—until that nation regains freedom.
